*Guide of questions to ask college admission counselors*

Visiting a College a campus looks different this year. While some will allow in- person visits, many will be virtual.

You can still get a sense of what a college, and life at that college, is like.

If making virtual visits it will be more important than ever to establish a relationship with the admissions counselors. It is okay to make multiple contacts and ask as many questions as needed. The checklist below may help you with some of those questions.

### Academics

- What is the average class size of introductory classes?
- Do you have an honors college?
- Do you have learning communities or other freshman experience?

### Academic Support

- What type of tutoring program do you have?
- How do you provide academic advice to students?
- Do you have a writing center and how do I access it?
- What kind of learning disability resources do you have?

### Financial Aid

- What is your average financial aid package?
- What work-study opportunities are there?

### Student Life

- What kind of dorm choices are there?
- How long are dorm accommodations guaranteed?
- How many students live on campus?
- What activities are offered to students? What clubs do you have on campus?
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- Can freshmen have a car on campus?

### Graduation

- What is your four-year graduation rate?
- What percentage of freshmen return for sophomore year?
- What type of career services do you have?
