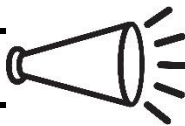


Your Scholarship

- If you are looking for scholarship opportunities now is the time to act!
- Beware that scholarship deadlines can be as early as **October**, and some run as late as April.
- Many scholarships will require additional steps including: an essay, teacher recommendations, transcript and submitting the FAFSA.

YOUR COLLEGE. It's important to learn as much as you can about additional financial opportunities from the colleges to which you've applied. College scholarships may be merit based, need based, or a combination of both. SOME college scholarships are renewable (often based on student performance) each school year.

- ☐ Visited your colleges' financial aid websites for important information and **deadlines**?
- ☐ Determined if you have an additional application to submit for scholarship consideration?
- ☐ Added your colleges to receive your ACT scores?

- ☐ Checked out the over 2 million dollars in scholarships from OSU-Newark and COTC?

- ☐ Athletes – checked with the Athletic office?

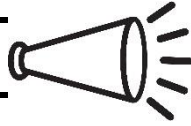

- ☐ Checked with your church, youth group or local youth-focused club like 4-H and Girl/Boy Scouts?
- ☐ Reached out to local service organizations like Kiwanis, Rotary, American Legion, Elks, Lions Club, or Freemason?
- ☐ Checked with your bank if they have a scholarship?
- ☐ Does your family get their electric or gas through the Energy Cooperative?
- ☐ Asked trade organizations (i.e. BIA, FFA) if scholarships are available?
